Discussed Caterpillar Motor Grader. Price of new grader with trade in would be \$51,700.00. Includes new wing and V-Plow.

Motion by Charlotte Michalik and a second by Sybil Zifko to have next annual meeting at 2:00 P.M. on first saturday following election. Motion carried.

Motion by Ila Bromberg and a second by Bill Slicer to go on record as opposing hunting bear with dogs. Motion carried.
